NWFSC INTERNAL ARTICULATION AGREEMENTS

following provisions apply to the articulation of coursework and Industry Certifications to college credits at Northwest Florida State College:

- 1. Students must have a standard high school diploma or GED to qualify and be fully admitted to Northwest Florida State College. Students must satisfy all applicable eligibility requirements and procedures established by the college.
- 2. Only career/technical, postsecondary vocational and selected advanced and professional course credits may be awarded through this plan. College preparatory and General Education courses are not available under this plan.
- 3. Credits granted under this system may be used to meet certificate/degree requirements in any applicable Northwest Florida State College program of study.
- 4. Students must initiate the articulation request.
- 5. Credits awarded through this articulation plan will not appear on the student's college transcript until he/she has successfully completed at least fifteen credits of coursework at Northwest Florida State College.
- 6. Credits awarded through this plan will appear on the student's college transcript with a grade of "P" (passing) and will not be counted in the computation of the student's GPA, regardless of the grade earned in the high school course and/or the score earned on the certification exam.
- 7. The award of credits based upon industry certification will be made only after receipt of official documentation of the certification via the certifying agency or testing vendor. Students are responsible for requesting this information.
- 8. The award of credits based upon high school or technical center coursework requires that the student earn a minimum grade of "C" in the applicable course(s). In some cases, a higher grade and/or additional verification of skills may be required.
- 9. Per program, not more than thirty (30) credits will be awarded to an individual student through this articulation plan. With the exception of the Paramedic program.
- 10. Where multiple options exist for the award of college credits, the student must choose among the college courses.
- 11. Technical elective credits may be used to meet certificate, AA, AAS, and AS degree programs as appropriate.
- 12. Award of such credits does not accelerate or guarantee admission to limited access programs. In such cases, students must meet all the eligibility requirements for the program, as well as go through the full application and selection process for the program. If selected for admission to the program, the courses earned through this articulation will apply to program completion as appropriate.

Note: This information should be used as a reference, as equivalencies, course numbers and program requirements may be updated throughout the year. State articulation rulings and accreditation standards may supersede these guidelines. Final decisions regarding the award of credits and the recording of credits on the student's transcript rest with the Registrar. Other applicable policies associated with transfer credits and external credits appear in the NWF State College Catalog and Student Handbook. To avoid confusion, students should consult with an NWF State College advisor.

Per FAA Advisory Circular 141-1B CHAPTER 4. DOCUMENT COMPLIANCE PHASE

4.3 Credit for Previous Training. A student who transfers from one part 141 pilot school and enrolls in another part 141 pilot school may receive credit obtained in the previous course of training in accordance with §§ 141.67(b)(1) through (5) and 141.77. The transferring student must present certified training records to the receiving school from the previous school, documenting topics and times of training completed and the result of each stage check. The receiving school must test a transferring student, document the results of that testing, and document any credit given. A student may not be credited with more training by the receiving school than was credited at the school from which the student transferred.

1. A student who enrolls in a course of training may receive credit for not more than 25 percent of the curriculum requirement for knowledge and experience received from other than a part 141 pilot school or 14 CFR part 142 approved aeronautical or flight training course.

2. A student who enrolls in a course of training may receive credit for not more than 50 percent of the curriculum requirement for knowledge and experience received from a part 141 pilot school or part 142training center.

3. The amount of credit for previous training allowed, whether received from a part 141 pilot school or other source, must be placed in the student's enrollment record at the time of enrollment
